Definitely! Our return on investment (ROI) is a key measure that represents the financial return on each dollar spent raising funds. ROI is an indicator of fundraising effectiveness, illustrating the amount applied toward the bottom line, in relation to the cost. In other words, for every \$1 spent raising funds in Fiscal Year 2024, our return was \$5.74.

She was an active member of the Trinity Health Nutrition Advisory Council, promoted child literacy through the Reach Out and Read program, and served on the hospital's governing board of trustees, where she chaired the Quality Committee and Community Health & Well-Being committee. Additionally, many in the community knew her as a regular reader for Mass at the Cathedral of Saint Andrew.

Advancing Radiation Oncology at Lacks Cancer Center

Thanks to the support of Saint Mary's Foundation donors, Radiation Oncology at Lacks Cancer Center is experiencing significant advancements with new technologies called SRS MapCheck and Visual Coaching. These are revolutionizing patient care and treatment precision. We spoke with Alan Mayville, lead medical physicist, about these groundbreaking tools and their impact.

SRS MapCheck is a cutting-edge quality assurance tool that ensures accuracy in radiation therapy. Mayville explained, "SRS MapCheck allows us to verify the accuracy of radiation beams with unprecedented precision, targeting tumors effectively while sparing healthy tissue. We make adjustments before treatment, ensuring each session's effectiveness."

Visual Coaching enhances patient understanding and engagement during treatment by providing patients with a visual representation of their

breathing, helping them understand the process and feel more in control. By visually demonstrating how their breathing aligns with what is expected, patients experience reduced anxiety and increased confidence, which is invaluable.

The integration of SRS MapCheck and Visual Coaching is a commitment to personalized, precise cancer-fighting care. "Our goal is to combine technological innovation with compassionate patient support," said Mayville.

"We are deeply grateful to Saint Mary's Foundation for their contribution, enabling us to enhance the precision of our treatments and improve the overall patient-care experience."

These technologies lead to better outcomes and improved quality of life. With continued investment in such innovations, Saint Mary's Foundation is paving the way for a brighter future in cancer care.

Increasing Safety with the THGR K9 Program

In 2023, Saint Mary's Foundation granted \$300,000 helping to launch the K9 program at THGR. This was the first full year of service for the K9 teams, which are proving to be invaluable for the safety and security of patients, staff, and visitors. Last year, the four K9 and handler teams underwent extensive training and certifications. The deployment of K9s to de-escalate volatile situations has had a significantly positive impact.

2023 Calendar Year-End Conflict Deployments:

- 41 total deployments to the Emergency
 Department with 31 successful de-escalations
- 23 total deployments to other areas in the hospital with 20 successful de-escalations

2023 Calendar Year K9 & Handler Achievements:

- 13,254 public contacts
- 140 visits with patients

One recipient wrote, "Thank you so much for paying for my room at Sophia's House for five days. My husband had a kidney transplant in May, and I stayed at Sophia's House for almost three weeks. 13 Breast Cancers Detected by the Mobile Mammography Program



In fiscal 2024, its first year of operation, the Mobile Mammography program, performed 2,010 screening mammograms and diagnosed 13 breast cancers! 764 patients from high-priority zip codes were screened. Saint Mary's Foundation provided and will continue to provide grant funding support.

Endowment Funds Highlights



David Baumgartner Fund for Mission Services funded rhythm instruments for spiritual growth groups in the psychiatric medical unit, allowing patients to express themselves in new ways. Additionally, the fund provided two chaplains with 16 hours of education on moral injury, trauma, spirituality, and healing. This training will benefit more than 100 colleagues receiving support and care from chaplains. The remaining funds support the production of Healing Blankets, assembled by volunteers, and distributed to patients by chaplains.
